Wearable Art with Upcycled Materials

Saturday May 11 @ 1 p.m. - 4 p.m.

Camila Salcedo is a Venezuelan-born and Tkaronto-based interdisciplinary artist working primarily in textiles and community art. Their work in WAHC's exhibition *Labour Pains* features wearable artworks made in response to the experience of artists living with brain injuries. In this workshop, participants of all ages are invited to learn hand-sewing techniques using upcycled materials to create simple wearable art pieces such as a vest or a tote bag/pouch.



We Are the Radical Monarchs

Directed by Linda Goldstein Knowlton

Saturday June 8 @ 2 p.m.

Set in Oakland, a city with a deep history of social justice movements, this documentary film examines the Radical Monarchs — an alternative to the Scout movement. For girls of color, aged 8-13, its members earn badges for completing units on social justice including being an LGBTQ ally, the environment, and disability justice.

The group was started by two fierce, queer women of color, Marilyn Hollinquest and Anayvette Martinez, as a way to address and center Anayvette's daughter's experience as a young brown girl. Their work is anchored in the belief that adolescent girls of color need dedicated spaces and that the foundation for this innovative work must also be rooted in fierce inter-dependent sisterhood, self-love, and hope.
